
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2024-2025 OVERNIGHT SEASON PRESELECTED DATES

- Our max capacity is between 300-400 depending on group sizes, bunk rooms utilized, and restoration work.
- If there is a date not listed and you have a minimum of 35 people, we can open that date up for you. This includes weekdays and Fridays.
- Groups can register up until 10 days prior to the overnight, depending on availability.
- Be advised, that we do bunk assignments based on group sizes, mixed gender groups, etc. We do not allow overnighters outside of your designated group reservation to sleep in your bunking area. Other groups may have to walk through your area to get to theirs, but groups do not share bunk rooms.
- Certain dates we CANNOT open up due to other events or holidays.

A NIGHT FULL OF HISTORY

1939 1941 1945 1962 1965 1969

Since 1972 more than 1 million children have come aboard the USS Massachusetts and experienced what life was like for those sailors who served aboard the battleship in WWII.

Our Nautical Nights program is offered to Scouts, Youth and School Groups, and even families! A visit to Battleship Cove is special. Spending an overnight on board one of the mightiest defenders of freedom truly is an unforgettable experience.

Although Battleship Massachusetts was designed to carry 1,800 men, she did her part to ensure victory, and sometimes carried nearly 2,300 on board throughout the war. Steaming more than 225,000 miles over four long years, Big Mamie rotated her crew frequently, hosting more than 6,000 different officers and crew by 1945.

You'll be sleeping exactly where these men slept: in authentic sailors' racks. Built of tough cotton canvas stretched across a sturdy aluminum frame, these racks will give you a firsthand feel of what it was like to be a sailor in World War II. Upon arriving to the museum, campers are led to their assigned bunkrooms where they may stow their sleeping bags and belongings. Followed by self-guided exploration and a hot meal, campers can further explore the vessel and partake in optional self-guided activities.

All programming is subject to change based on weather and staffing.

CHECK-IN PROCESS:

Check-in is between 2:00 PM TO 4:00 PM. Please provide us with an estimated arrival time so we may know when to expect your group. You may arrive earlier to explore but, you can only check-in at your designated time with your belongings.

Parking is in the FENCED, GRAVEL LOT under the bridge OR at the Narrows parking lot down the street.

Registration forms need to be emailed, not mailed to reduce the risk of spaces filling up while in transit

DEPOSITS and FINAL PAYMENTS:

•The group's deposit of \$40 per person must be received within 2 weeks after submitting a registration form.

•All deposits and final payments are NON-REFUNDABLE

•NO REFUND OR CREDIT is given to groups if their reservation number changes after final payment. For example, if you pay for 20 campers and confirm only 16 are attending, you will not receive a refund or credit. We recommend reserving a smaller number first and adding more as you confirm.

•A reservation will only be deemed confirmed if you received an email stating you have been booked.

•Final payments must be received no less than 30 days prior to your group's arrival date. There are NO REFUNDS.

•Upon advanced notice, 10 days, a group may cancel due to an emergency/health concern, and reschedule a visit, as long as there is space available to do so.

•If you are making reservations within 14 days of your arrival date, full payment is required.

•All groups must obtain a certificate of liability insurance and send us a copy prior to arrival if we do not already have it on file.

Museum Policies and Guidelines

You are about to embark on a unique adventure, the following safety rules are necessary for your visit here to Battleship Cove. Leader's, please brief your group on the following safety rules prior to arrival.

- 1. No Running.
- 2. Wear proper footwear. NO BAREFEET.
- 3. Do NOT climb or hang on any artifacts and structures.
- 4. Be aware of overhangs, lights, and bulk heads.

5. Treat ladders like a ladder, NOT, a staircase. Ladders are steep. Use three points of contact while utilizing the ship's ladder.

6. Do NOT lean over the sides of the ship or through lifelines. In addition, please stay on or below the main deck after dark! After sunset, the upper decks are off limits due to safety concerns.

7. Leaders/Chaperones must remain with their groups during their stay. All campers should stick to the buddy system.

8. Respect our ships and collections, as this is an historic site. Vandalism or theft will result in police intervention.

9. NO SMOKING on any vessel at Battleship Cove. We have a designated SMOKING AREA by out security booth.

10. No Drugs or Alcohol are permitted. If we suspect anyone is under the influence, they will be removed. If we find that drugs or alcohol have been brought on board, it will be confiscated and you will be removed If property is damaged due to the result of drugs or alcohol, the person involved will pay a fine.







Museum Policies and Guidelines Continued

11. NO firearms or weapons of any kind are allowed.

12. Please do not tamper with bunks. If you have an issue with a bunk, inform Nautical Nights staff immediately.

13. Food and drink are only allowed to be consumed in designated areas such as the WARDROOM, WARDROOM ANNEX or CLASSROOM during the 9 PM film. Bunking areas, main deck, or exhibit are NOT allowed at any time. Please be cautious of the food you bring on board. Leaders/Chaperones/Scouts may have an allergic reaction to certain items brought on board.


14. Battleship Cove (USS Massachusetts Memorial Committee, Inc.) is not responsible for lost or stolen items. If you have lost an item, contact a staff member, or call the museum. We do have a lost and found on board, anything left unclaimed after the overnights donated.

16. Please be aware that Battleship Cove will refuse entry to patrons exhibiting behavior that is unruly, disruptive, irresponsible, or illegal in nature.

17. Please note that ships and exhibits other than the battleship close for the evening as the museum closes for daytime visitors. They will reopen again the next morning for normal museum visitation hours, this is for safety purposes. If you have any questions, ask Nautical Nights staff.

18. ANY OVERNIGHTER WHO PULLS A FIRE ALARM WILL BE REMOVED FROM THE CAMPUS AND A \$500 FINE WILL BE APPLIED TO THE GROUP!

First Aid is available to injured campers. Please contact staff for assistance. We must fill out an ACCIDENT REPORT for any accident onboard. For injuries more serious than minor cuts or scrapes, we send the camper to the local hospital for treatment. If you are unable to locate a staff member, contact someone at the snack bar in the wardroom.
